MISSIONARY UPDATE: ANDY ENGBRETSON LOCATION: THIRD WORLD

Dear Family and Friends,

I'm on my way with a team of five to Minga Mission Hospital in Zambia, where we'll be training the maintenance staff on how to operate and care for a new 400-kilowatt solar power system — complete with batteries, inverters, a generator, and utility integration. EMI helped design the initial system for the hospital, then partnered with Zambian designers and installers who spent two years bringing it to life.

When EMI first visited two years ago, the hospital experienced frequent power interruptions — sometimes going days without electricity. Since the new system came online just two months ago, they haven't lost power once. Our team's job this week is to equip the hospital's staff with the knowledge and skills to keep this system running for generations to come, so the hospital can continue delivering excellent health care to the community it serves. What a privilege.

Please pray with us:

- For wisdom and clear communication as we deliver the training
- For the trainees — that they would understand well and feel equipped and confident
- That our morning Bible studies together would bear lasting fruit in all of our lives
- That the light of Christ would shine brighter throughout this region — quite literally through this new source of power for the hospital
- For protection and strength for Megan and the kids while I'm away

I also wanted to share a brief update on my trip to Bongolo Hospital in Gabon at the end of February. Our goal was to help the hospital's leadership determine the best location for a new maternity building that EMI had designed a few years earlier. We spent meaningful time with the leadership team, walked the site carefully, and developed several design concepts. In the end, our team arrived at the same recommendation the previous EMI team had made — that the original proposed location was by far the most practical and cost-effective choice. The leadership agreed.

You might wonder: if we reached the same conclusion, was the trip necessary? We came to believe it was exactly what the Lord intended. The maternity building location had become a genuinely complex and sensitive decision for the hospital community, and several key decision-makers hadn't been part of the earlier process. Our visit gave everyone the chance to work through the complexity together, experience the site firsthand, and arrive at a shared conclusion — together. What God seemed to be doing, more than anything, was bringing unity.

And that is a deeply Christ-honoring thing. We were reminded of this during one of our team devotionals in Psalm 133 — "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!... For there the Lord has commanded the blessing, life forevermore."

We are so grateful for your partnership in prayer and support. These trips — whether the outcome looks like we expect or not — are never wasted in God's hands.
